

MLA Citations for WMS Readers & Writers & Researchers

The following are examples of how to properly cite your sources. Examples are given for books, encyclopedias (both print and online), articles from ProQuest, and websites. The first example is a generic one. It is followed by a real citation. If your source is missing any information, that's okay, just skip over it.

BOOK

Lastname, Firstname. *Title of Book*. Place of Publication: Publisher, Year of Publication. Medium of Publication.

Curtis, Christopher Paul. *The Mighty Miss Malone*. New York: Wendy Lamb Books, 2012. Print.

ENCYCLOPEDIA ENTRY - PRINT

Lastname, Firstname. "Title of Entry." *Title of Encyclopedia*. Volume number. Year of Publication. Print.

Mercuri, Becky. "Cookies." *The Oxford Encyclopedia of Food and Drink in America*. Ed. Andrew F. Smith. Vol. 1. 2004. Print.

ENCYCLOPEDIA ENTRY - ONLINE

Lastname, Firstname. "Title of Entry." *Title of Encyclopedia*, Year of Publication. Web. Date of Access.

"Einstein, Albert." *Encyclopaedia Britannica Online*. Encyclopedia Britannica, 1999. Web. 27 Apr. 2009.

NEWSPAPER or MAGAZINE ARTICLE from ProQuest

Lastname, Firstname. "TITLE OF ARTICLE." *Title of source*, Date of source: page number. *Database name*. Web. Date of Access.

Vargas, Jose Antonio. "THE FACE OF FACEBOOK." *The New Yorker*, Sept. 20 2010: 54. *ProQuest*. Web. 4 Dec. 2013.

WEBSITE

Lastname, Firstname. "Title." Name of Webpage. Name of Website, Date of Publication. Web. Date of access.
